September 10, 2013: President Mike Simonson opened the meeting.

Invocation: Wilson Strickhausen gave the invocation.

Program: Cece Hipps, Executive Director of the Haywood Chamber of Commerce was our guest speaker today. They currently have 500 members and in 2012, served 158,500 people by telephone, e-mail and at their welcome centers in Waynesville (6,650), Lake Junaluska (102,000) and Maggie Valley. The welcome centers on Walnut Street in Waynesville and Maggie Valley are walk-in centers and the Bethea Welcome Center at Lake Junaluska is self-serve. The most asked questions are "When are the leaves going to change?" and the 2nd most asked question is "When is Maggie's Galley going to open". Their annual events include the Melange of the Mountains which features 12-15 local restaurants. This event really helps our community to know what great restaurants are available year round. The Blueridge Breakaway is a bike riding event which brought in 469 riders in 2013 and had a total economic impact of \$150,000 to Havwood County. The Apple Harvest Festival in October brings in 40,000 – 45,000 attendees each year and has an economic impact of \$6.3 million. They will have 154 vendors this year and will feature arts, crafts, food, regional music and entertainment. The Chamber has 22 board members, 31 ambassadors and 3 staff members. Their annual budget is \$226,000 and community events bring in \$6.45 million to Haywood County. They hosted an "Elected Officials Reception" this past year which gave our officials an opportunity to speak to our local business owners. They had 36 ribbon cuttings this past year for new businesses and held quarterly luncheons for women in business. Their "Young Professionals Club" is geared towards men and women under 40 years of age who want to network with other young professionals in their community. They also hold an "Issues and Eggs" monthly breakfast meeting. They have several leadership programs that are ongoing as well as a "Business Start-Up Competition" which awards \$10,000 to potential businesses.

Music: Maestro Jackey Webb, led us in singing "God Bless America".

We are expecting to serve/deliver 2,000 meals. Tom asked each member to bring six (6) 12-can cases of Coke or Pepsi products. Bob Mitchell said he will not be able to be the "Delivery Co-ordinator" this year because of family commitments and asked for a volunteer. Margie Brockmiller has come to our rescue and has agreed to take his place. Thanks so very, very much Margie!!! Ann Kline will be the "Kitchen Co-ordinator" and Judith Antross will be the "Floor Co-ordinator".

Calling all Golfers-Jim Hoyt announced that the "Kiwanis Cup Golf Tournament" will be held on Monday, September 16 at Lake Junaluska Golf Course.
